Meetings

Pastoral Council	– July 13
Security Council	– June 15
Men's Group	– June 17
Woman's Group	– July 3

This ordinance applies henceforth, now, and forever... This Missal is to be used by all churches,... this present Constitution, which will be valid henceforth, now, and forever, We order and enjoin that nothing must be added to Our recently published Missal, nothing omitted from it, nor anything whatsoever be changed within it under the penalty of Our displeasure... Furthermore, by these presents [this law], in virtue of Our Apostolic authority, We grant and concede in perpetuity that, for the chanting or reading of the Mass in any church whatsoever, this Missal is hereafter to be followed absolutely, without any scruple of conscience or fear of incurring any penalty, judgment, or censure, and may freely and lawfully be used... and that this present document cannot be revoked or modified, but remain always valid and retain its full force...

If we take this document seriously, then we never needed Sumorum Pontificium nor the indult before that in order to say the TLM. Priests have the moral and legal right to say the TLM anytime they want. What keeps us from doing it is the fear of reprisal that the bishops are “technically” not allowed to do per the decree of Quo Primum. The reality is that they do. We see it today. Good priests who are only doing what they are supposed to be doing, teaching the truth, and they are being punished by their bishops.

If we cannot “get away with” teaching the truth, why would we think we can get away with saying the TLM?

Now in our diocese, we have a special blessing in that our bishop is fine with the TLM. I have no doubt, though, that he will require me to get an indult from him for us to continue. We have the comfort that he will grant me an indult so that we can continue.

There are many priests who will not be granted an indult and will have to say the Mass underground or not at all. People, dioceses and large geographical regions will be deprived the graces of this Mass. Bishops who say “all are welcome” will say “but not

you.”

The song and idea that “all are welcome” needs to be heard and read in this light: By all are welcome, what the liberal, modernist, socialist tyrants mean is that all are welcome who fully agree and comply with their mandates and way of thinking or who will at least keep their mouth shut and go through the motions with them. In other words, “all are welcome” means “comply or die.”

These anti-TLM bishops will punish and take away the priesthood of anyone who tries to say the TLM. I do hope that they incur the penalty of Pope Pius V’s displeasure. May he come and haunt them, torment them, and not let them rest for a moment until they relent.

More important than the displeasure of Pope Pius V is the displeasure of God Himself. I do believe that God has a special place in His heart for the TLM. While the new Mass may be acceptable to God, I do not believe for a moment that God would appreciate the hatred and ridicule that so many clergy and laity show for the TLM. It is a form of sacrilege and that comes with a high price.

We could get into the question of why they hate and ridicule the TLM so much, but suffice it to say that they have no supernatural faith at best or have given themselves over to the dark lord at worst.

- In emergencies to help people exit the building and to implement other emergency procedures. (Again, training will be provided)
