These are a few of our options:

1. Have several hours of open adoration times for people to come and go as they need to. This will require some people scheduled to be there so that the Jesus is never alone. The Eucharist would be exposed in the monstrance and there would be no benediction at the end. We would need to know what days work best and what times we would want the church open for this.
2. Have have a simple one hour time of adoration when Fr. Robideau could be there in case no one else is there so that Jesus is not left alone. Again this would be with the exposed Sacrament in the monstrance and people could come an go as they need to. We would need to know what days and times work best.
3. Have a structured holy hour with prayers and time for silence, all followed up with benediction. We would need to know what days and times work best.
4. We can combine 1 & 3 and have several hours for open adoration with either the first or last hour being structured with prayer, silence and benediction.

With any of the options, we need to know how often we would like to have them.

Please fill out the questionnaire this week or next week and I will give the results to the Pastoral Council so we can talk about it.
